Course Registration Period	Registration occurs during orientation week for new students when
	they meet with their academic advisor. Students should submit a list
	of requested courses (and alternates) to the Inbound Exchange
	Coordinator by May 1 (for semester 1 students) or November 30 (for
	semester 2 students) so that an effort can be made to reserve space in
	the requested classes. Students studying for a full academic year will
	have the opportunity to pre-register online in November or April for
	their second semester of study at St. Edward's University.
Course Syllabus	Course syllabi are provided by professors at the start of each term.
Credit system	The semester hour is the unit of measurement for work completed.
	Normally, a semester hour of credit means the successful pursuance
	of a course requiring 50 minutes of class time a week for 14 weeks
	plus a week of finals. Most courses are worth 3 semester hours of
	credit. International students on F-1 and J-1 visas must be enrolled in
	a full course load of at least 12 hours each semester. An average

VISA

Accepted students will apply for a J-1 student visa. A DS-2019 document is required before a visa application can be submitted and the DS-2019 will be issued by The Office of International Education after the student is officially accepted and has submitted all required documentation. Guidance on applying for a J-1 student visa and associated fees will be provided along with the DS-2019 document. The DS-2019 will be issued for the amount of time the student is approved to study at St. Edward's University by their home university. Students may enter the USA no more than 30 days prior to the program start date on the DS-2019 and should leave the country no later than 30 days after the program end date.

Once the application and supporting documents have been received and reviewed, the DS-2019s will be sent to the Exchange Coordinator at the home university by mail via Fed Ex.

MANDATORY HEALTH / MEDICAL INSURANCE

One of the requirements of the J-1 visa is health insurance that meets the minimum level of coverage set by the Department of State. To ensure that all our exchange students have health insurance that meets or exceeds the necessary coverage levels, **students will be required to enroll in and purchase the St. Edward's University health insurance plan for the duration of their stay.** The amount for one semester or one year of St. Edward's University health insurance is included on the Certification of Finances form.

MANDATORY VACCINE FOR BACTERIAL MENINGITIS

The state of Texas requires that all students enrolling in a college or university are required to have a vaccine against bacterial meningitis (meningococcal vaccine). This vaccine should be current (given within the past 5 years) and received no later than 10 days before the start of classes. Students will not be eligible to register for orientation or courses until documentation of the vaccine has been sent to the St. Edward's Health and Counseling Center. If the vaccine is not available in a student's home country, they should contact the Office of International Education for assistance. DRIVING

Students can drive in Texas with most international driver's licenses for up to one year, but should carry a translation of the license (such as the International Driving Permit or "international driver's license"). Students studying in the USA for more than one year are eligible to apply for a Texas driver's license. It is recommended that anyone planning to drive in the USA review the Texas Drivers Handbook, available at http://www.txdps.state.tx.us/DriverLicense/documents/DL-7.pdf.

Most exchange students choose not to drive as public transportation (city bus) is easily accessible. Students can also purchase a bicycle if they wish.
