	This course is open to APS and APM students who studied Vietnamese Level 2 at APU.
	This course is equivalent to Vietnamese Level 3 (Intermediate).
	After completing the course, students will receive 4 credits for Intensive Language Learning Overseas (Language Education Subject).

1	Course Objectives	This course emphasizes practical oral and written Vietnamese language through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Local excursions and field trips reinforce language exercises. After completing this course, students will be able to:

		• Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, place of work, address;
		• Ask and answer about everyday activities, language abilities
		• Get information about time and date;
		• Get simply instructed about train and bus schedule, course time-table;
		• Ask for prices and bargain at the market;
		• Converse simply about family status and family members;
		• Demonstrate basic understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions.
		[Vietnamese II]
		• Buy air and train tickets and ask information on trips and flights, means of transportation, ticket, flight arrangement, travel time, tourism spot, tourism option;
		• Interact in coffee shop and restaurants to order foods and drinks, name of Vietnamese special foods and drinks, restaurant ordering, customer's compliment or complain;
		• Give and receive details on location and direction such as address, map, situation of getting lost, orientation description;
		• Converse about family relationship terms, marriage status, family condition;
		• Demonstrate basic understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions;
		• Read and write texts of 200-300 words on popular topics;
		• Speaking Vietnamese language naturally and accurately on popular topics;
		• Demonstrate understanding of Vietnamese cultural interactions.

		• Interact confidently in stores and shops;
		• Talk about health status and talk with a doctor;
		• Talk on telephone and leave a phone message;
		• Talk about travel plans or report a journey;
		• Make hotel reservations;
		• Communicate plans and intentions;
		• Read and write texts of 200-300 words on popular topics;
		 Speaking Vietnamese language naturally and accurately on popular topics;

	Vietnamese Language course: Total instructions hours will be 60. Classes will be conducted 4 periods per day from Monday to Friday. One class period is 50 minutes.
	Classes are from 10:05-11:50 and 13:00-14:50 with 10-minute break. Each class will be divided into two sections: one that focuses on alphabet and pronunciation; one that focuses on grammar, vocabulary, conversation and practical use of the language.
	Students are also strongly encouraged to practice with their Vietnamese language partner and while participating in daily life in Ho Chi Minh City.
	Study tour and Cultural activity: Total activity time is 50 hours.
