1)	Course Objectives	This course emphasizes practical oral and written Vietnamese language through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Local excursions and field trips reinforce language exercises.
