Reco quali know	ommended ifications / vledge Course Objectives	 This course is open to APS and APM students. Students who are currently taking Malay/Indonesian 1 this semester or students who have successfully completed the course. This course emphasizes practical oral and written bahasa Indonesia through dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. The course gives students basic language skills for everyday living, including carrying on simple conversations. Local excursions and field trips reinforce language exercises. After completing this course, students will be able to: Introduce themselves: name, nationality, job, workplace, address, families and hobbies. Ask and answer about everyday activities, language abilities with the grammar that they have learned at STBA LIA. Make simple sentences and communicate in simple conversations; Ask for prices and bargain at the market; Ask about directions; Make some Indonesian traditional foods; Demonstrate basic understanding of Indonesian folklore; Compare the difference between Indonesian and Japanese (their country) cultures; Play an Indonesian traditional instrument.
(Standards for Course Completion	 Students must: Participate actively in class, homestay program and field trip program; Complete all assignments on time; Communicate verbally in bahasa Indonesia with the instructor and classmates on a variety of topics; Use the learned words and grammar accurately in order to communicate effectively; Make friends with language partners and other Indonesian students;

3. Teaching Method	This course emphasizes practical oral and written bahasa Indonesia by using communicative methods. Students practice dialogues, listening comprehension exercises, sentence pattern drills, and grammar exercises. Some language partners will help students to practise conversations together.

It will be conducted by STBA LIA Jakarta in the end of the language course. Post-lecture: Attendance, group presentation, assignments 20% Credits: 2 (Counted as credits for the Fall 2013 semester.)
