2. Curriculum

♦ Subject Changes due to Curriculum Reforms ♦

In the 2011 academic year, APU undertook a curriculum reform in which 4 Areas of Study were established in each college. These reforms apply to students enrolled in AY 2011 and later. Students under the AY 2006 curriculum will, in general, continue their studies as before, however please note that due to the reforms a number of new subjects have been created, as well as some subjects were removed.

- New Subjects: New subjects established by the AY 2011 curriculum reform will be opened gradually over the course of several years. Students who enrolled at APU in 2010 or earlier may also take these new subjects.
- Changes to Subject Names: As a rule, if students complete any subjects which have had their names changed in or after AY 2011, they will be registered under the new subject name.
 - 1) Any subjects that students have already completed under the old name will appear in their grade reports, etc. under the old name.

2) Any subjects students complete in or after AY 2011 will appear in their grade reports, etc. under the new name.

- Changes to Subject Fields: If a subject's field changes due to the curriculum reform, as a rule, AY 2006 curriculum students will take subjects and receive credit for them under the AY 2006 curriculum subject names. Although AY 2006 curriculum students will enroll in and complete the same classes as students studying under the AY 2011 curriculum, please be aware that subject names and the fields under which subjects are tallied may be different between the two curricula.
- Cancelled Subjects: Subjects that will be cancelled will be done so over the course of several years in order to ensure that AY 2006 students can complete their studies.

Notes on Course Registration

- Course Registration involves not only carrying out the procedures for registering classes, but also making the decision regarding which classes you wish to take. It is the most important part of your academic planning, and it is necessary in taking classes, receiving credit and graduating. To help facilitate the planning of all students, always take utmost care when registering. Please do not register for courses you do not plan to attend, as this may prevent other students from registering.
- Likewise, please be sure to attend the classes that you have registered for.
- All students are required to print out a copy of their verification screen after completion of the course registration period. This "Course Registration Confirmation" will be proof that you have registered for a course.
- Students expecting to graduate in March 2015 who are uncertain about meeting the required credit criteria should plan to register and complete extra credits.

③ AP Languages

Registration can be carried out during the regular registration period. Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- The language subject that they are registering for is not their native language. Students who register for a course in their native language will have their registration deleted.
- Japanese-basis students must have completed or be exempted from 'Intermediate English I and II' and English-basis students must have completed or be exempted from 'Japanese Advanced Course I' or 'Pre-Advanced Japanese.'

Grade evaluation for Korean language courses includes scores from the Hangul Language Proficiency Test. The deadline for applying to take this test is Wed. October 1 at 16:30. Please take note if you intend to register for Korean language classes.

6. Notes for Specific Colleges/Programs

(1) To APS Students

Students who complete 20 or more Major Education Subjects in their cluster will have the cluster field name included on their degree. If a student has completed 20 or more major credits in multiple clusters, the name of the cluster in which the student completed the most major subjects shall be included on their degree. For details regarding APS clusters, please refer to the Undergraduate Academic Handbook.

(2) To CAP Students

CAP students must complete 30 credits from their enrolled CAP program (or CAP count subjects from their enrolled college) and complete at least 124 credits total in order to graduate. Japanese-basis domestic and international students both must also complete 20 credits of major education (either college) or foundation education subjects held in the English language. In the event that CAP students who are in their last semester have not met the necessary criteria to graduate as CAP students, but HAVE met the criteria for APS or APM, they will instead graduate as normal students.
