



A. 輸出シェア (%)


Export Shares

Import Shares




Trade Relations: China Eclipses the Pacific Alliance Partners

B. 対日貿易 単位:10億ドル Japanese Trade



Rising Chinese GDP and Defense Budget Trends


国内総生産=単位:一兆ドル 左- GDP Left Scale

防衛予算=単位 : 10億ドル 右- Defense Budget Right Scale




日本への訪問者数に占めるアメリカ人のシェアの低下 *America's Declining Share among Visitors to Japan*

The U.S.-Japan-Asia-Triangle





In 2009/10, the number of international students in the U.S. increased 2.9% over the previous year to 690,923 students.


