ELIGIBILITY Students must be enrolled as full-time students at the partner institution and be nominated to EBS by their home university. UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS : should have completed two years of study before their mobility. However, a detailed study of their profile and academic performance will be taken into consideration.	A regular full-time academic load is 60 ECTS per academic year, so usually 30 ECTS / semester . Each institution may have different requirements for study abroad and students should check with their coordinator / academic advisor. In the French academic system, grades range from 0 (lowest) to 20 (highest).The minimum passing grade is 10/20 (and the grade 20 is almost never awarded).

Before their arrival, all students must provide proof of coverage for: - Medical / hospitalization For EU students: European Health Insurance Card can provide proof of basic coverage. - Repatriation - Personal liability (requirement in French education system) N.B.: students enrolled for one academic year should register (free of charges) with the French social security system for basic coverage (more details on Campus France here).	It is each student's responsibility to obtain all updated details about their visa application. EBS will provide an official Admission Letter to each student once their complete application has been reviewed and accepted. Visa applications are reviewed by Campus France and French consulates. EBS cannot intervene in the process.
