Hong Kong Shue Yan University (HKSYU) is the first private university in Hong Kong. Based on its pedagogical philosophy on Chinese traditional culture and virtues, it offers liberal arts education with a focus on professional and vocationally-oriented training. It has currently over 4,000 students.

The main campus of HKSYU is located at Braemar Hill, North Point, comprising the Main Academic Building, the Library Complex, the Student Residential and Amenities Complex, and the Research Complex.

HISTORY

HKSYU was founded in 1971 by Dr. Henry H.L. HU and Dr. CHUNG Chi Yung as Shue Yan College in response to their concern on the acute shortage of tertiary places for local secondary school leavers aspiring for university education. Attained the current university title in 2006, HKSYU stands to be the first private university in Hong Kong.

Admission Requirement	 Preferably: English language: Overall band score of 6 with no band lower than 5.5 in International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic: Cumulative GPA of 2.5 and above The home university may recommend a student who does not fully meet the requirement but has the capability to complete her/ his study at HKSYU. The final decision to admit the student is determined by HKSYU.
Course/Unit Load per Semester	Under normal circumstances, exchange students may enroll into 4-5 courses or 12-15 credits (3 credits per course) per 15-week semester. Registration with less than 12 credits will be allowed with prior approval.
Number of Hours per Week per Course	3 contact hours per week for each 3-credit course
Number of Weeks of Study	15 weeks per semester and 2 weeks of examinations at the end of each semester
Available Courses for Registration	The majority of exchange students will choose courses at 1st to 3 rd year levels. Course selection is subject to prior approval of the respective Department, especially for the subject that may be considered as too difficult to the student or requires prerequisites. The International Unit will assist all exchange students in course selection and registration, and the change of course registration during the add/drop period.

Accommodation

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On-campus Accommodation	Yes (normally twin shared room) The campus of HKSYU consists of the Residential and Amenities Complex, Research Complex, where halls of residence are provided for students. Accommodation will be provided for each exchange student. The undergraduate residence is gender segregated by floor and is designed in dormitory style, which the residents live on the same floor share communal facilities. (https://www4.hksyu.edu/hmu/)

On-campus Accommodation Fee (2020/21 academic year)	HKD1,900/month per person for twin room
Meal Plan (if available)	Students are responsible for their own cost of living including meals. They may purchase their own meals from the canteen located on the 1/F, Residential & Amenities Complex. In addition, a Pacific Coffee café is located on the 1/F of the Low Block of Research Complex, and eCafé is located on the 5/F of the Main Academic Building.
Other Facilities	 Residence may access the Internet in her/his room through the connection of her/his own computer to the LAN port with appropriate LAN card and cable (CAT5). Each room is air-conditioned, and furnished with basic necessity such as desks, chairs, bookshelves, beds (no bedding), and wardrobes. Common facilities include showers, common rooms with TVs, pantries, microwaves, Smartcard-operated washing machines and dryers, fitness room, and indoor sports court. Students are responsible for their own cost of living including meals and air-conditioning.

Visa Requirement, Process, and Fee

All non-local students are required to apply for a student visa once the exchange application is accepted by HKSYU, which can be arranged through the International Unit of HKSYU, with the necessary supporting documents. It will normally take six weeks for the Hong Kong Immigration Department to process a visa application upon receipt of all the required documents. Exchange students are advised to apply as far in advance as possible.

The current student visa application fee paid to the Hong Kong Immigration Department is HK\$230. If the fee is paid by HKSYU, the University will collect the fee from exchange students upon their arrival at HKSYU.

Normally, the Immigration Department in Hong Kong requires the following documents, though they may ask for other additional information:

- Form ID995A (http://www.immd.gov.hk/eng/forms/forms/id995a.html) completed and signed by the student
- Form ID995B (http://www.immd.gov.hk/eng/forms/forms/id995b.html) and Letter of Acceptance completed and signed by the sponsor (arranged by the International Unit of HKSYU)
- Photocopy of the student's identity card and/or travel documents (e.g. passport)
- One recent passport photo of the student (affixed on form ID995A)
- Academic transcript
- Evidence of the student's financial standing in English or Chinese (bank statements, passbooks, proof of scholarship funds, etc.) If someone is sponsoring the student financially, that person must submit a declaration stating her/his relationship to the student, her/his intention to support the student's study and living expenses and her/his financial standing

Mandatory Health / Medical Insurance

Non-local students are required to have suitable and adequate insurance for the entire period of their study at HKSYU. The insurance should cover, but is not limited to, travel, personal accidents, medical expenses (accident and non-accident), hospitalization and emergency evacuation/ repatriation. Exchange students will be required to provide proof of adequate health insurance coverage before their arrival.

Living in Hong Kong

Climate

Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical, tending towards temperate for nearly half the year. There are four seasons all the year around: cold and dry winter, unstable and wet spring, hot and humid summer, and warm and pleasant autumn. The rainy season in Hong Kong is from May to September. Typhoons usually occur during the summer.

During November and December, there are pleasant breezes, plenty of sunshine and comfortable temperatures. January and February are relatively cloudier, with occasional cold fronts followed by dry northerly winds. The temperatures may occasionally drop below 10°C in urban areas.

Food / Meals, Leisure, Transportation, and Personal Items

Exchange student should allow for HKD3,000 to HKD5,000 (USD390 to USD650) per month for living costs other than accommodation. Please note that the estimation is a point of reference for preparation purposes only.

Majority of exchange students do not have a bank account in Hong Kong. Therefore, before an exchange student comes to Hong Kong, s/he may consider to carry travellers cheque or your local currency to exchange local cash at the airport or other foreign exchange providers. Besides, it is advisable to prepare HKD10,000 (USD1,200) - HKD20,000 (USD2,500) in cash for her/his first two months living cost in Hong Kong, including cost on accommodation, textbooks or other additional necessities.

Under normal circumstances, exchange students will not open a local bank account in Hong Kong just for the exchange period, especially for those coming for exchange for one semester only. If an exchange student really wishes to have a bank account to be opened in Hong Kong, s/he will be requested by the bank to have at least HKD5,000 (USD650) to be deposited in the account throughout the whole exchange period. Having said that, only a small number of local banks will provide such service to exchange students.
