# University Overview

The University of Wisconsin–La Crosse (UWL) is a public university in La Crosse, Wisconsin. Founded in 1909, it is a leading comprehensive university as part of the University of Wisconsin System offering bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. With 9,600 undergraduate and 1,000 graduate students, UW-La Crosse is composed of four schools and colleges offering 102 undergraduate programs, 31 graduate programs, and 2 doctoral programs. UW-La Crosse has nearly 85,000 alumni across all 50 U.S. states and 57 countries. Located on the great Mississippi River surrounded by towering bluffs and meandering rivers, La Crosse is home to 51,000+ (metro: 136,000+) people. Look for bald eagles soaring overhead and listen for nostalgic riverboat whistles. Whether trekking the La Crosse River marsh or hiking the bluffs, your path runs through UW-La Crosse!

Course Prerequisites	Generally, 100 and 200 level courses are open to incoming students. Entry to some 200 and all 300 and 400 level courses require proof that student has taken relevant prerequisites at their home university.				
Grading System	A semester grade point average is calculated by dividing the grade points earned by the number of credits attempted that semester. The cumulative average is the total number of grade points earned divided by the total number of credits attempted. GPAs are not rounded; they are truncated at two digits and a zero is added as the third digit for all students. <u>UWL grade point</u> averages are determined only by grades in UWL courses.				

### English Proficiency

Where the primary language of instruction at the home university is not English, applicants must satisfy the English language requirements for entry to the program. Updated entry requirements located at the <u>international student</u> <u>admission website</u>.

### **Course Registration**

Accepted students will receive an email from Miranda Panzer, Incoming Exchange Contact, with information on how to register for next term's courses. Students submitting complete applications by priority deadlines listed above are usually eligible to enroll in courses first day undergraduate registration opens.

### Accommodations

Exchange students are required to live on campus. Students will be emailed online housing application link once accepted for exchange study. No housing deposit is required. Students living on-campus are required to enroll in a campus meal plan. Housing application includes meal plan options. Incoming students can select <u>Reuter Hall</u>, apartment style living or <u>Eagle Hall</u>. Housing is assigned on a first come first serve basis.

### Student Visa

Admitted exchange students will be issued a Form DS-2019 to apply for a J-1 visa. The acceptance package, including immigration documents, will be mailed to their home university representative through DHL or another mail service. Students are responsible for completing all steps to apply for their visa. Information about the J-1 visa is available at <u>BridgeUSA</u>.

#### Health/Medical Insurance

J-1 (visa) Exchange students are required to participate in UWL's International Student Insurance plan. IEE enrolls students in this insurance plan prior to their arrival on campus. ### **Orientation Fee**

All exchange students are charged an International Student Orientation Fee their first semester at UW-La Crosse. This fee goes towards meals, programming, transportation costs, materials, facilities rental, personnel fees, and other

miscellaneous costs to achieve a successful orientation program that acclimates exchange students to the UW-La Crosse campus and community.

# **International Student Fee**

All exchange students are charged an International Student Fee each term that goes towards the shipping/mailing expenses of immigration documents, professional memberships and affiliations for compliance assurance, training and staff development, emergency response systems for international students, software costs to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations, and other miscellaneous costs including program and event supplies.

## **International Health Insurance**

Exchange students are required to have health insurance coverage in order to be in compliance with Federal and Institutional regulations. UW-La Crosse offers affordable health insurance coverage through our insurance provider. Each semester that students are enrolled, they will be automatically signed up for coverage and will be billed directly to their student account.

# Notes to Tuition & Fees:

- 1. DLE Canvas Technology fee is charged to all students attending UWL and varies depending on the number of credits (\$2.00/credit).
- 2. Special course fees are assessed to cover supplies and expenses for certain university courses. The Cashiers Office maintains a listing of information regarding current <u>special course fees</u>.
- 3. The Eagle meal plan is listed here. Meal plan selection is made on an individual basis. More information about the cost of specific meal plans can be found at the <u>University Centers website</u>.
- 4. More information about specific room rates can be found at the <u>Residence Life website</u>.

**NOTE:** Actual student costs can vary **significantly** based on housing choices, meal plan choice, and student's non-academic expenses.
