

<u>ゼミの進め方 / How this seminar class is</u> implemented

The seminar aims to introduce students to transdisciplinary research by analyzing global efforts to deal with major crises and threats—or the absence of such efforts. Students will develop basic research skills and gradually prepare for graduation theses or research reports. The first year will be focused on writing a literature review and developing a research proposal, and the second on implementing it. Each seminar session will include common readings and individual presentations. Students will have to submit written progress reports and continuously improve them.

There has been a growing interest in IR about the Global South, so this seminar is an excellent place to explore its implications. This is also a transdisciplinary seminar, so students interested in non-traditional issues are welcome.

The seminar is the first time you will commit to one topic for two years. It may sound long, but it is relatively short. Your active commitment will pay off in the future. <u>ゼミの進め方 / How this seminar class is</u> implemented

While fall semester focuses on research design skill [How to write], spring semester is more on reconciliation and peace studies literature [How to read]. Students will be given a series of questions alongside with a reading list to prepare for each class. They will then lead the seminar by summarizing the readings, discussing core issues, presenting their writing, and most importantly, peer reviewing classmates' work. After a series of writing and reading sessions, students will organize a teaching session on their own research theme employing a creative pedagogy. A detailed version of syllabus will be distributed during the first class.

本ゼミの魅力 / Why this seminar

This seminar aims to introduce APU students in International Relations and Peace Studies to a broad range of historical and contemporary research as well as relevant methodologies. The primary objective here is to expose students to various research skills and approaches involved in historical and policy analysis. It also seeks to help them in developing their own individual research design that hopefully will become the basis for their graduation thesis. To achieve these goals, students will read textbook-style materials and examples from journals, edited collections, and books; but they will also carry out practical design (or re-design) work in teams or individually.

A course like this is by nature both abstract and

practical. It is not about philosophy of science or the sociology of knowledge, nor is it a survey of various qualitative (or quantitative) approaches to social science. The aim here is to figure out how to DESIGN a concrete research effort, from asking a question to coming up with a proposed answer to that question and then doing empirical work that sheds light on the proposed answer. It is one thing to learn how to accomplish these tasks in the abstract, but the only real way to grasp them is to try and carry them out in practice. By working through a specific issue with others, one begins to get a concrete sense of the implications of otherwise abstruse design decisions.

- (3) Attach a research proposal (appx. 500 words excluding citations and references)*
- * How to write a research proposal:
- [1. Research question] Start with a research question. "Turkish-Armenian Reconciliation since 1950s" is NOT a research question. Make it as narrow as possible, as detailed as possible, ending with a question mark (e.g. "How does the younger generation perceive the G-word debate in the Turkish-Armenian relations today?" or "To what extent does the German parliament's decision on Armenian genocide affect their reconciliation process?")
- [2. Background] Briefly explain why it is important to find answers to the raised question
- [3. Literature Review] Present what has been researched (by other scholars) and what is remained to be explored (by you)
- [4. Methodology] Describe how you will be collecting data using which method
- [5. Originality] End with a clear argument on how your

research outcome will contribute to the existing IR knowledge world (what is new in your research outcome)

[6. Reference] In the reference list, put ONLY books and journal articles you cite in the proposal. Make sure you properly use APA or Chicago citation style.

The deadline for consultation/interview is one week before the application submission to the Academic office. Any email arriving later than that will not be taken into account. The selection will be based on your research proposal, interview during the consultation, and whether you took Peace Studies (ENG) in advance.

<u>ゼミの進め方 / How this seminar class is</u> implemented

3年ゼミでは、人間の安全保障、或いは、国際平和に関連する問題で、自分が関心を持つ社会問題について理解を深めるために、関連文献を読むなどの形で調査・研究を行い、3年次末までに、4年ゼミで執筆する卒業レポート或いは卒業論文で検討する具体的な「問」を決定してもらいます。4年ゼミでは、その問に対する答えを見つけるための調査・研究を行い、卒業レポート或いは卒業論文を書き上げてもらいます。

毎週のゼミでは、数人ずつ順番に、調査・研究の結果を発表してもらいます。発表の際は、事前に報告資料(パワーポイントのスライド、或いは、レジュメ)を準備し、全員に配布する必要があります。また、発表者を含めて、毎週、調査・研究の結果をまとめた進捗報告書を提出してもらう予定です。

尚、本ゼミは日英両言語開講であり、日本人学生には報告資料を日 英両言語で用意してもらう必要があります。口頭発表は日本語でも構いませんが、出来るだけ英語で行うようにして下さい。日本人でない学生の場合は、英語のみで構いません。卒業レポート或いは卒業論文は、日英どちらの言語で執筆しても構いません。

In the third year seminar, you will conduct research by reading relevant literature to deepen your understanding of the particular social problem of your interest that falls within the realm of either human security or international peace, and by the end of their third year, you are required to determine a specific research question(s) to be examined in your graduation report or thesis that you will write in the fourth year seminar. In the fourth year seminar, you will conduct research to find the answer(s) to your research question(s), and write a graduation report or thesis.

In the weekly seminar, several students will take turns to present the results of their research. When making a presentation, you need to prepare a presentation

Oral presentation may be given in Japanese, but use of English is strongly encouraged. For non-Japanese students, it is OK to prepare a presentation material only in English. A research report or a thesis can be written either in Japanese or English.

本ゼミの魅力 / Why this seminar

This seminar provides opportunities to meet and interact with such people.

continuous efforts of those who aspire to it. It is difficult to achieve a truly peaceful and just society, but if such efforts weaken, the social conditions will worsen. This seminar seeks the participation of students who share this recognition and aim to realize a peaceful and just society.

Therefore, previous residency in the region is highly desirable.

In principle, those who wish to enter graduate school, whether in Japan or abroad, will be required to write their thesis in English and present their research at the Asia Pacific Conference.

Those interested in development policy and international cooperation are encouraged to take courses such as "Global Poverty", "Introduction to Sustainable Development", and "Development Policy" which are offered not only in APS but also in other colleges related to development policy and international cooperation.

In the area (c), it would be more desirable if you can read and conduct research in Spanish (Portuguese for Brazil). Research instruction is also available in the areas of (d) medical economics in Japan, (e) health care in Japan, and (f) economic development in Japan. However, we do not recommend that students who wish to enter graduate school in areas (d), (e), and (f) take this seminar unless they have no other choice.

APU has many faculty members who specialize in developing countries. Therefore, I have listed some information that may be useful for those interested in research on developing countries when comparing and selecting a seminar.

<u>ゼミの進め方 / How this seminar class is</u> implemented

The goal of Seminar I and Seminar II is to provide students with methods, tools, and techniques to conduct and write academic research.

Seminar I (Spring) focuses on data analysis with R. R is a programming language that provides a wide range of statistical and graphical techniques.

In the first quarter (Q1), students will learn how to manipulate data (e.g., how to reshape data sets, how to merge data sets, how to aggregate data sets, etc.), how to plot data statically, dynamically, and interactively (students will build an online dashboard with R Shiny). In Q2, students will study econometrics (linear model) and learn how to use R to estimate a linear model. As final exercise, an academic paper will be replicated in the field of international trade.

Seminar II (Fall) focuses on research methodology. By the end of the seminar, students will acquire the tools to design their own research.

During the seminar, topics such as the purpose and significance of research methodology, the types of research (quantitative and qualitative), definition and formulation of a research problem, literature review, ethics will be discussed. Additionally, students will be introduced to LaTeX, a high-quality typesetting system used for the production of technical and scientific documents.

Students are expected to replicate the code in class and out of class, and read the material in advance for discussion in class.

There are three broad overall objectives of this seminar:


- 1) Think creatively and critically, act individually and collectively, and write coherently and constructively about culture, society and media.

This seminar implements a 2-course seminar sequence in Blockchain Programming for the Ethereum Blockchain / Smart Contracts, primarily following a key textbook of choice: (1) "Mastering Ethereum: Building Smart Contracts and DApps," (2) "Beginning Ethereum Smart Contracts Programming With Examples in Python, Solidity, and JavaScript, 2nd Ed.," or other textbook, at the professor's discretion. Students will also become familiar with basic blockchain technology, and additional topics in Bitcoin as well as Python, etc. may also be covered.

This course will require substantial IT skill and the frequent detailed setup and maintenance of multiple software tools.

As the course proceeds, focus topics may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Basic concepts/topics concerning cryptocurrency
- 2. Introduction to the Ethereum blockchain
- 3. Ethereum basics
- 4. Ethereum clients and tools for Smart Contract development (covered as needed)
- 5. Cryptography, keys & addresses
- 6. Wallets
- 7. Transactions
- 8. Smart Contracts and the Solidity Programming Language (primary language)
- 9. Ethereum Development Environments
- 10. Other EVM-compatible Blockchains: Flare, Songbird, Coston, etc
- 10. Smart Contracts with Vyper

About Graduation Research (4th Year work): In general, students will be required to develop their own working Solidity project using the skills they have acquired in the 2-semester Seminar, and then write either a Report or Thesis based on that working project or projects. For the Report option, submission of a Software package/Smart contract set, along with a Demo Video and Summary (in accordance with University Guidelines) may be possible, with advance consulation and approval by the Professor (advance approval required).

本ゼミの魅力 / Why this seminar

The objective of this course is to provide students with basic and core knowledge and programming skill in cryptocurrencies, blockchain, and web3, with a focus on developing smart contracts and other resources for the Ethereum and other EVM-compatible blockchains.

The intention is to provide an enabling avenue for students who wish to deepen their knowledge and expertise in IT, as a supplement to their social science and language skills, for the purpose of supporting application to graduate school in Computer Science, IT, or an allied field, or seeking/acquiring post-graduation employment in ICT (specifically blockchain-related).

This is a serious, HANDS ON course in Blockchain and Web3 programming, and requires substantial motivation and programming skill prior to beginning the seminar. It does NOT focus on either trading techniques for

cryptocurrencies or social perspectives/implications of blockchain and cryptocurrencies.

1. This is a serious, HANDS ON course in Blockchain and Web3 programming.

In order to be able to follow the text, students MUST have substantial programming skills and experience BEFORE entering this course.

- 2. Optimally, students should have a strong interest in ICT (preferably blockchain), and should have taken and done well in the following courses by me:
- a. Media Production Lab (My section on the Linux O.S.); high grade required (A+ or A, or equivalent performance up to the time of the interview);
- b. Web Design or equivalent knowledge in HTML/CSS.
- c. Programming (VB .NET; my section is preferred).
- d. My ICT Special Lecture in Python or equivalent knowledge of Python (some Python use very likely)
- e. Some JavaScript knowledge would also be helpful.
- 3. Since this is fundamentally a 2-semester course (Part
- 1: Fall; Part 2: Spring) that covers topics in a focus book in sequence, students who wish to enter the seminar in the Spring (not Fall) may have trouble following the material and completing projects during their first semester.
- 4. Note about PC requirements:

As a course in blockchain programming and development, this course requires that the student have and maintain their own modern computing resources (recent-model PC or MacBook, with plentiful memory (both RAM and disk storage; preferably, a large external SSD memory) and a good, reliable internet connection).

****DO NOT attempt to take this course using an older model, or poorly-working or maintained PC.***

In other words, the student we hope to have is " a person who wants to understand economics and mathematics (even if he/she thinks it is difficult), to learn how to derive intellectual property, or to produce a new intellectual property by combining multiple pieces of intellectual property, rather than seeking results". Possible applicants to graduate schools of economics or economics-related international affairs, whether domestic or abroad, are also welcome to participate. The messages for students are the following three:

(1) Never miss a seminar.

- (2) Do what you are told to study, investigate and think on your own without relying on others.
- (3) It is okay to be wrong at first, but learn the right way later. Those include international and national environment or development NGOs/NPOs; UNrelated organizations, media sectors; local and national government offices; environmental consultancies; companies promoting sustainable development activities; education sectors; think-tank organizations; setting business/NGO; graduate schools in Japan (e.g. the University of Tokyo, the University of Kyoto), in the UK (e.g. the University College London, the University of Birmingham, the University of West England), and elsewhere (e.g. the University of Pennsylvania; the University of Freiburg, the University of Hong Kong).

Having listed these achievements of the past students, this seminar hopes that the beneficiary of one's research activity is not for the researcher (so a student is not doing the research activity for him/herself), but for those being studied or for a wider society.

<u>ゼミの進め方 / How this seminar class is</u> implemented

ゼミは毎回、前半と後半の二つの内容をすすめる。

前半は、ゼミテーマに関する教員の指定した文献(日本語および英語)についての発表と質疑応答。ゼミ参加人数によって調整するが2~3名で協力して、スライドを用いて論文内容の発表を行う。また、発表者以外の全員もその文献について内容をワードにまとめ、質疑応答に参加する。後半は、各自の卒論テーマに関する進捗発表を行い、研究を進める。ゼミ合宿は今のところ未定ですが、学期初めや終わりに新歓コンパや忘年会をやりたいと考えています。

The seminar proceeds with two segments in each session. In the first half, students present and discuss literature assigned by the instructor related to the seminar theme, which includes both Japanese and English texts.

Depending on the number of participants, groups of two to three students cooperate to present the content of the papers using slides. Additionally, all other participants are required to summarize the literature in a Word document and participate in the Q&A session.

In the second half, each student gives a progress report on their thesis topic and advances their research.

例えば、東日本大震災後の消費者の食品・産地に対する意識の変化やその情報の確度の影響を消費者調査・市場調査をもとに研究しています。そのほか、カーボンニュートラル社会を目指す中での住宅における太陽光設置に関する住民の意識分析を研究しています。消費者調査研究としては、日本、アメリカ、台湾などで実施しており、共同研究としては国内、アメリカ、台湾、インドネシアの研究者らと実施してきました。
