Management seminar I: Deciding on a research topic and literature review

1. Week 1: Introduction and welcome: Discussion on seminar requirements
2. Week 2: Exploring ideas about research projects
3. Week 3: Students present their research proposals and discussion on them.
4. Week 4: Students present their refined research proposals.
5. Week 5: Students report on at least one journal article/publication on the idea that they have about the topic of their research projects. Types of publication that students review may vary depending on the type of research project they choose.
6. Week 6: Students report on first set of at least three journal articles/ publications on the topic of their research projects. Types of publication that students review may vary depending on the type of research project they choose.
7. Week 7: Students report of the second set of five journal articles/publications on the topic of their research projects. Types of publication that students review may vary depending on the type of research project they choose.
8. Week 8: Students summarize the articles/publications that they have reviewed so far.
9. Week 9: Explores the feasibility of the research project: Whether is available and/or can be accessed for the topic of the research project.
10. Week 10: Students contact potential sources of data and ensure that they can access the data.
11. Week 11: Discussion on conceptual framework and literature review - 1
12. Week 12: Discussion of conceptual framework and literature review - 2
13. Week 13: Discussion on the scope of research projects
14. Week: Summary and revision
