# Scholarship

### Health Insurance

The Japan National Health Insurance plan (NHI) is not available to short-term students in Japan. If you become ill or get injured during your stay in Japan, the high medical costs you may incur will be entirely your own responsibility.

In order to prepare for such a situation, APU policy mandates that short-term, international students must have health insurance coverage that meets or exceeds the coverage set below as a condition of enrollment.

Please make sure to purchase a suitable insurance policy which covers the below before departure, and remember to bring a copy of your insurance certificate with you when you come to Japan. If the certificate is written in a language other than English or Japanese, be sure to bring an English or Japanese translation.
