

Japanese Language Subjects

6 Japanese language subjects at different levels are offered for graduate students. They are not required subjects. Students who wish to take Japanese language subjects <u>must</u> take a placement test beforehand.

Research Supervision

The majority of your courses are seminar-style courses taught by your supervisor with the eye on successful completion of the doctoral dissertation.

Plan for Research Supervision

Based on a research plan written by you, your Supervisor will supply you with a Plan for Research Supervision, which will be a tool to help lead you to successful completion of high-quality research, as well as a reference point and benchmark of the progress of your research.

A Plan for Research Supervision is valid for one year, and will be created at the start of the 1st, 3rd, 5th, and subsequent semesters based on an updated plan for research created by yourself.

Doctoral Candidacy (Registration for the Award of Doctoral Degree)

What?

Doctoral Candidacy is the condition for students to be eligible to submit their dissertation for examination. This is done by showing their capacity and vigor in conducting their research independently.

How?

Requirements

- Passing the **Dissertation Proposal Defense**
- Passing the Pre-Candidacy Oral Examination
- Acquisition of **24 credits**
- Submission of Dissertation chapters (must include: Introduction, Literature Review, Methodology, Findings/Results, and Discussion)
- Submission of the application form

Students are also encouraged to submit published or conference papers to show that they have the potential to advance in their field.

- Published journal articles
- Conference papers
- Papers written as part of the classes Research Paper I / II

Graduate Research in Progress Seminars (GRiPS)

The GRiPS are organized several times per semester, and are open to all GSA Faculty and students. They provide doctoral students with a great opportunity to gain presentation experience, receive constructive feedback and receive a formal report on their progress from GSA faculty, as well as learn from their peers.

Doctoral students are required to give a presentation at GRiPS twice:

- 1) Dissertation Proposal Defense by the end of the 2nd semester
 - The Dissertation Proposal Defense is evaluated by the supervisor as well as one or two other GSA Faculty members to help verify if the proposal meets the level normally expected of a GSA student.
- 2) Pre-Candidacy Oral Examination before applying for candidacy
 - The Pre-Candidacy Oral Examination is evaluated by the supervisor as well as one or two other GSA Faculty members, usually the same faculty from the Dissertation Proposal Defense. It is an oral presentation that functions as condition to satisfy for students to be allowed to submit an application for Candidacy. Students will be unable to apply for Candidacy until they can satisfy the expectations of their supervisor and faculty evaluators that they are ready to do so.

Doctoral Dissertation: Submission and Screening

Doctoral Dissertation – Final research paper required to complete the Doctoral Program.

- Dissertation is the result of original investigation and should embody a critical appraisal or analysis of a primarily or secondary source.
- Dissertation should be deemed a contribution to a body of knowledge and be worthy of publication.

Submission Requirements

- Doctoral Candidacy
- Preparation of all required documents
- Approval from your supervisor

Doctoral Dissertation Examination

The examination process usually takes 6 months to 1 year. Consult with your supervisor regularly and keep this schedule in mind when preparing the submission of your dissertation!

Submitted dissertations are reviewed by the Dissertation Committee and if endorsed, sent to the Examination Committee. The Examination Committee consists of your supervisor, one internal examiner (APU), and one external examiner (outside of APU).

Review the "Procedures for the Conferral of Doctoral Degree" and the Examination Flow Chart before submitting your completed dissertation to the Academic Office.

The Handling of Dissertations after Completing the Program

A hard copy of the dissertation will be archived in the APU Library. A soft copy will be uploaded to the APU Library / R-cube and to the National Diet Library in accordance with the Japanese Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) requirements that all doctoral dissertations be made publicly available online.

Writing Support

Turnitin: All graduate students can use Moodle, APU's LMS (Learning Management System), which includes the Turnitin Plugin to aid them in preparing their academic written assignments. Use Turnitin regularly to improve your research and writing skills.

Mendeley: You can create an account on Mendeley, a reference management tool offered by Elsevier. Mendeley allows you to organize academic articles and share information online.

Academic Misconduct

Academic misconduct refers to any breach of the University regulations including prohibited or unethical actions for the purpose of obtaining credit, achieving higher grades, or avoiding a Fail grade. **Students found to be cheating/plagiarizing are punished accordingly (e.g. revocation of scholarships, suspension, or expulsion)**.
