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
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Academic Calendar (Annual Schedule)

- A session is a weeklong class period at the beginning of each of the long vacations.







Research Projects

Research Projects Summary





All students need to conduct research under the direction of a supervisor and prepare an extended piece of writing (Research Project) that follows formal standards of research.

There are four types of Research Projects: Master's Thesis, Independent Final Report, Internship-based Case Study, and Business Plan.

All Research Projects must be based on real data, be accurate and clear, and include completely all sources of quotations, citations and the use of other materials. Students should consult with their supervisor and decide together which one suits their research interests best.

> Main Differences between the four (4) types of Research Projects

- The four types of Research Projects respond to different research purposes and different research methods.
- The choice of Research Project type offers the opportunity for students to pursue a variety of research topics and methods of inquiry.
- The four types of Research Projects differ in their degree of abstraction, generalization and practical applicability.



Students should submit a summary of their Research Project and a notice of the type of Research Project they are writing before they submit their Research Project in their final semester. The summary and the type of the Research Project must approved by your supervisor.

Seminars



Outline of Seminars



Seminars are classes where students meet with their supervisors to discuss the progress of their research. The Seminars must help develop an inquiring mind in students and inform them that issues, research questions or hypotheses that they address need substantiation based on evidence and argument. They should train students about the method of collecting, synthesizing and drawing defensible conclusions based on data. The Seminars are designed to assist students their individual research, leading to the production of the Master's Thesis, Independent Final Report, Internship-based Case Study or Business Plan.

> Seminar Structure

◆ Individual Meetings: organized between the students and the supervisor.

Work in Progress Seminars: students present the progress of their research at these seminars to their supervisor and other faculty members. The Work in Progress seminars are open to all graduate students and faculty to attend.

Choosing a Seminar Supervisor

Choosing a Seminar Supervisor

Students should choose a supervisor and report their selection to the Academic Office for approval by the Dean. After the selection of a supervisor is approved, students will be registered for their chosen supervisor's seminar subject in the designated periods.

Seminar Orientation Session

A Seminar Orientation Session is organized to help you learn more about the structure of the seminars, and the characteristics of Research Projects and receive tips on how to search/select a supervisor. > Plan for the Research Supervision

Students fill out their information, research topic, and research plan on the designated form and share it with their supervisor. After their supervisor fills out the Research Supervision Plan section and signs the document, students submit it to the Academic Office.

Students may specialize in one of the following four fields if they complete certain requirements. **NOTE**: Completion of specialization is **NOT** mandatory and students may choose to complete the MBA degree without Specialization.

> Application

Definition

Students should apply for their desired Specialization when they report the selection of their supervisors to the Academic Office (at the end of the first semester).

Requirements

To obtain a specialization, students must :

- Complete at least 4 Elective Subjects (8 credits)
- Choose a supervisor affiliated with your chosen specialization

Confirmation of Specialization Completion

Completion of Specialization is confirmed at the end of the final semester when the complete assessment results are announced. Students who satisfied the above Specialization requirements can apply for a Specialization Certificate.

In addition, students whose primary specialization is AF, MM, or EIM (meaning they have fulfilled the requirements above for any of these three specializations), and who have completed more than 4 Elective Subjects (8 credits) from JM, can apply for a Double Specialization. Students whose primary specialization is JM cannot apply for a Double Specialization. Please see the right side of the table below for a visualization of the possible Double Specializations.

Accelerated Completion Programs





>Academic Misconduct
